In the most recent revision of the income guidelines section of the HEAP Desk Guide, a change was inadvertently made to the amount which is added to the income guidelines for each additional person in Tier I households containing nine (9) or more members.

The amount for each additional person over 8 members was incorrectly changed to \$26. The correct amount is \$306.

The revised amount for each additional person for Tier II (\$84) is CORRECT in the new Desk Guide.

A new Desk Guide with a revision date of 2/29/00 is available on E-Lib along with this GIS.

In addition to correcting the error in the income guidelines section, two changes have been made to the "Emergency HEAP" section of the Desk Guide:

- o A note has been added to reflect the availability of the second regular benefit for non-utility heaters.
- o Language has been modified to reflect the availability of a second utility emergency benefit.

Please disregard all other versions of the HEAP Desk Guide and use only the version with the 2/29/00 revision date.

The HEAP Benefit Issuance Matrix has also been revised to reflect the addition of the second utility emergency benefit. A revised version, revision date 2/29/00, is available on e-lib.

Districts should also make a pen and ink change to page 3 of the "Dear HEAP Liaison" letter dated February 17, 2000. The letter incorrectly refers to a

EMBRGENCY HEAP

Availability of Regular HEAP

Regular HEAP benefit must be utilized first when available and sufficient to ameliorate the emergency. The benefit is sufficient when it is at least equal to the cost of utility service for the most recently completed monthly billing cycle immediately preceding the date of application or when a non-utility fuel delivery can be obtained. If the regular benefit is not sufficient it is combined with an emergency benefit, as outlined below, provided the household meets all eligibility criteria for emergency HEAP.

NOTE: A second regular benefit is available for households paying separately for non-utility fuel, effective 2/16/00.

Income Guidelines

The maximum eligibility guidelines are utilized. However, income tier must be established to determine the appropriate pay code for WMS. A household is categorically eligible and placed in Tier I if at least one member of the HEAP household is in receipt of recurring FA, SN, FS, or Code A SSI.

Resources

All available liquid resources must be explored, documented, and utilized. For heating equipment replacement, up to \$3,000 in liquid resources are exempt.

Benefits

- 1. Utility Emergencies (Heat or Heat-related only)
 - a. Heat related domestic only \$100
 - b. Natural gas heat only \$235
 - c. Natural gas heat combined with heat related domestic \$335
 - d. Electric heat \$485 (\$385 heat plus \$100 for heat related domestic)

A second emergency benefit is available effective 2/26/00. Each benefit buys a minimum of thirty (30) days of prospective service. A full benefit or the total balance due, which ever is less, is issued.

2. Non-Utility Heating Emergencies

Benefit amount of \$400 (eff. 2/16/00)

A second emergency benefit is available, effective 2/16/00.

- 3. Supplemental Amounts (if appropriate criteria are present):
 - + \$25 Tier I household (\$50 for a combined utility bill)
 - + \$50 Vulnerable member in household
 - + \$50 More than 4 person household (\$100 for a combined utility bill)
